# CHURCH INTERIORS RENDERING PROPOSAL

## BALCONY – NAVE – TRANSEPTS (2) - SANCTUARY

---

- PAINTING, PLASTER REPAIR AND DECORATIVE PAINT
  - Preparatory work:
    - Repair and restore all damaged wall and ceiling surface areas
    - Oil based primer over all repaired areas
  - Finish work:
    - Apply 2 coats of paint to all wall and ceiling surfaces
  - Decorative work:
    - Per rendering
  - Artwork:
    - Per rendering



# RENDERING PROPOSAL

## FLOORING

---

- Remove asbestos tile
- Sanctuary
  - Furnish, deliver and install CI Porcelain Tile\*
- Nave
  - Furnish, deliver and install CI Luxury Vinyl Tile\*

\* Includes carpet removal, remove and reinstall pews, new backerboard, build-out of risers



# RENDERING PROPOSAL

## SANCTUARY FURNISHINGS

---

- Manufacture, deliver and install the following furnishings:
  - Ambo
  - Altar of Sacrifice
  - Presiders Chair
  - Deacons Chair
  - Communion Rail

Design based on current furnishings with stain and faux painting to match.





# RENDERING PROPOSAL LIGHTING

---

- Furnish and deliver 6 LED Retrofit for existing Pendant Lights
- Furnish and deliver 8 Spot and Flood Lights

## GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

---

- Coordination of meetings with Church Interiors
- Renderings
- Interior decorating services
- Photometric analysis for lighting
- Acoustical analysis for Sanctuary and Nave

# RENDERING PROPOSAL

## COST SUMMARY 2022

---

1. Painting, Plaster Repair.....	\$339,750*
2. Flooring & Asbestos removal.....	\$108,268
3. Sanctuary Furnishings.....	\$67,500
4. Lighting.....	\$17,568
5. General Requirements.....	\$6,500
<b>Total.....</b>	<b>\$539,586</b>

\* Artwork and decorative work (painted canvas & stenciling) represents ~\$50k - \$75k of total
